I was born in Drama, Greece, in November 1966. I have a B.Sc in Applied Mathematics from Aristotle University, Greece and a Ph.D in Computer Networks from Humboldt University, Berlin, Germany (1995). I served in the Greek Army until the end of 1996, I held a postdoctoral appointment at the Department of Computer Science, Rutgers University, New Brunswick, (1997), and a faculty appointment at the Computer Science Department of SUNY Stony Brook (until 2000) and at the college of Computer Science of Northeastern University, Boston (until 2003). I returned to Greece in May 2003 to join the Faculty of the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering of Democritus University, where i was elected full Professor at the end of 2007. I also held appointments as Visiting Professor at TU Berlin and MIT Boston in 2006 (summer) and 2009 (Jan-Sep), respectively. My research interests lie mainly in transport/network layers including the design and evaluation of energy-saving, real time, delay-tolerant or space protocols as well as the design and evaluation of mechanisms for congestion control, routing, quality of service and reliability.

I was/am editor for IEEE Transactions on Mobile Computing, the Journal of Computer Networks the Journal of Wireless Communications and Mobile Computing the Journal of Mobile Multimedia and the International Journal of Parallel, Emergent and Distributed Systems. I edited several special issues on related topics and chaired the 2002 conference on Internet Computing as well as the Wired/Wireless Internet Communications 2002 and 2004. I participate(d) in several Technical Program Committees in my area of expertise, such as INFOCOM, GLOBECOM, ICCN, ISCC, EWCN, WLN, and several others.

I have graduated 5 Ph.D students and around 30 Masters.
